

## SEDER PLATE

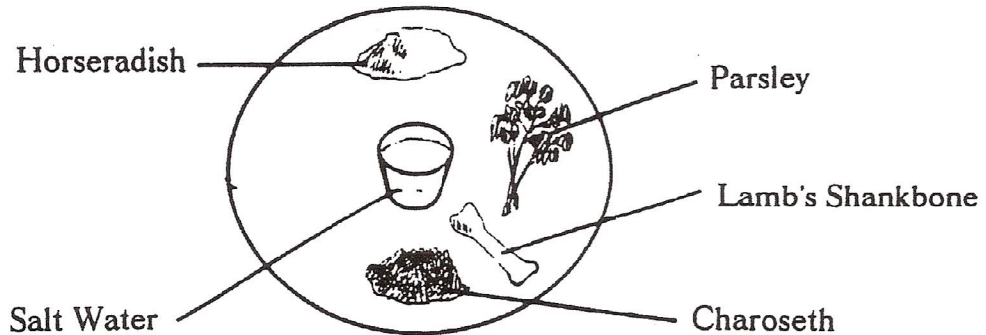
The seder plate is the ceremonial setting for the first part of the service. Included are items which will be partaken of to help the people better understand the meaning of the holiday. There will need to be one seder plate (use a 10 inch plate) per table or per 10 people. The following is a list of items to be included on the seder plate and the proportions for each person or per plate as indicated:

<u>Item</u>	<u>Definition</u>	<u>Quantity</u>
Karpas	Parsley	1 sprig per person
Maror	Ground horseradish (preferably red)	1 teaspoon per person
Charoseth	Apples, nuts & spices (recipe on page 12)	1 tablespoon per person
Salt Water	(for dipping of Karpas)	1-2 1/2 oz. cup per plate
Zeroah	*Shankbone of a lamb	only necessary at head table

\*The shankbone can be obtained from the local butcher. He will know what bone you desire. Remove the meat from the bone and then roast the bone in the oven until dry and brown. The shank bone is only required for the head table,

(It may not be necessary for you to obtain a bone if you are having a Chosen People Ministries worker lead your seder and you have verified that he will be bringing a bone.)

The placing of the items on the seder plate is as follows:



II. Each table should have:

- a table covering (roller paper or plastic, white in color)
- simple decorations (see page 3)
- two tall candles (blue or white) with holders (Be sure to have matches at each table if fire regulations will allow candles to be lit.)
- One paper dinner plate of matzo - approximately one sheet of matzo for each person (This matzo will be the bread substitute.)
- one "Unity" (see page 8)
- sugar
- non-dairy creamer
- salt and pepper
- one seder plate (see page 7)

III. Each place setting must have:

A. At time tables are set:

- one napkin
- two styrofoam cups (for beverage and water)
- one clear plastic 6 oz. cup filled with grape juice
- plastic silverware (2 forks, 1 spoon, 1 knife, 1 soup spoon)
- one 6 inch plate
- one Haggadah (These may be purchased at a quantity discount from Chosen People Ministries or you may want to make your own notes. Please place your order well in advance of the seder if you are ordering CPM Haggadahs.)

B. For later use:

- one dinner plate
- one soup bowl
- one dessert plate

Note: Whenever possible use disposable silverware, plates, and cups. This is not only to make clean-up easier, but because religious Jewish people use special dishes for Passover, dishes that have never touched leavened bread (Exodus 12:19).

Also: A pitcher of grape juice is not provided, as the people are instructed to only sip during the service so that the one cupful will last the entire time.
